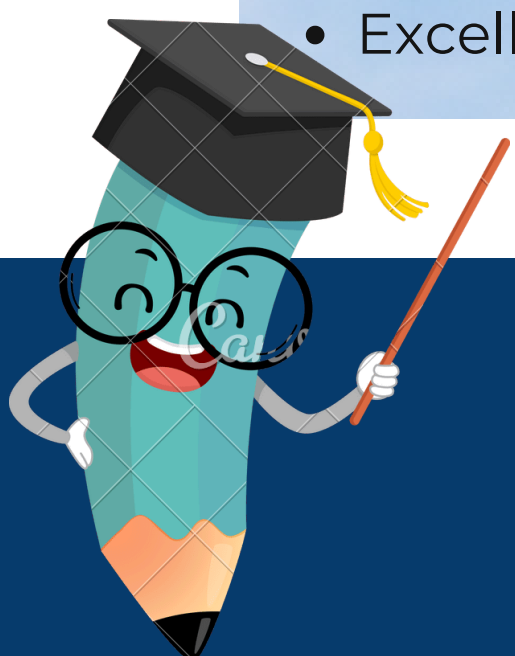
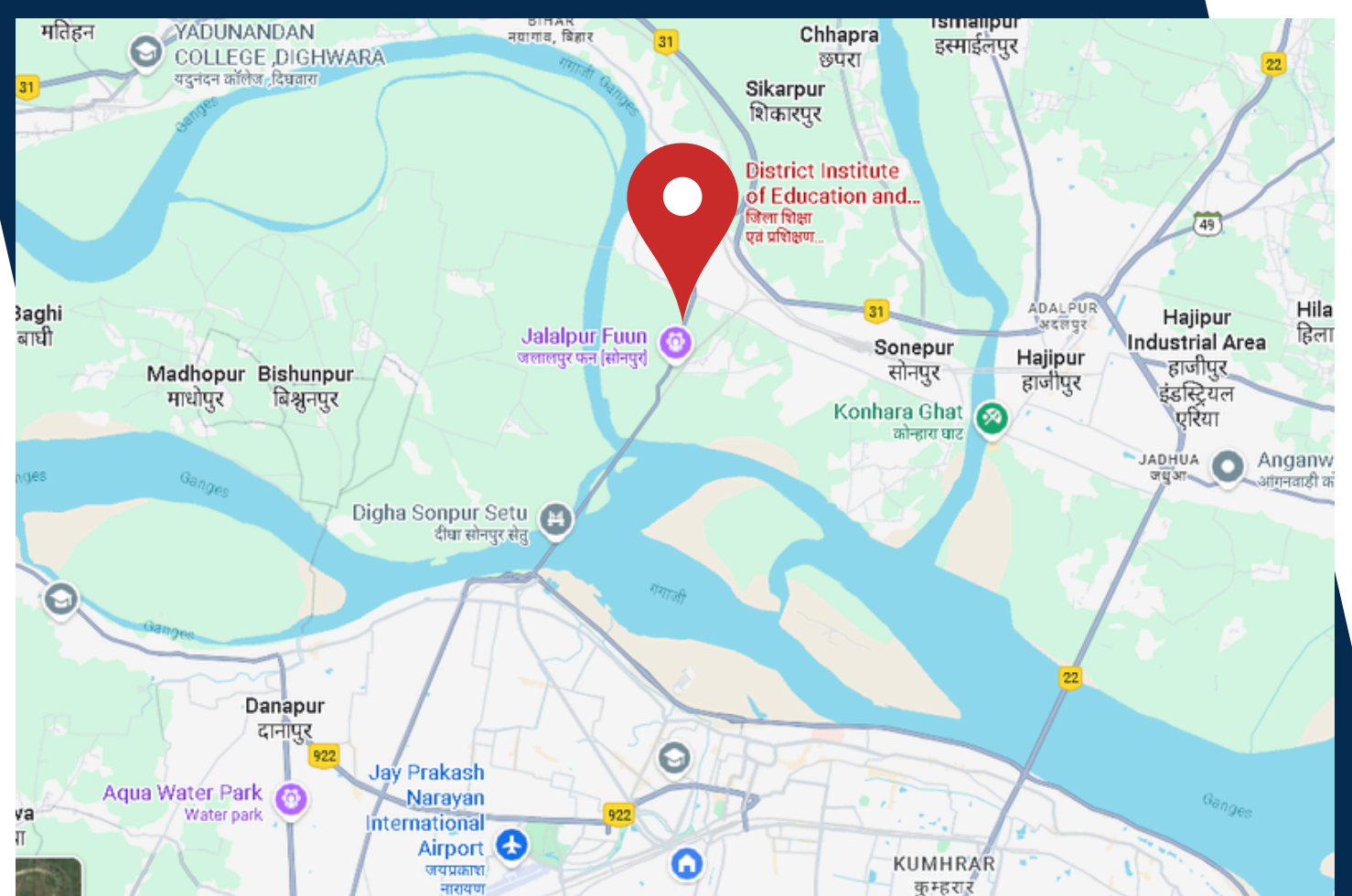

DIET, Sonpur has excellent transport connectivity. The institute is directly connected by both rail and road networks. The distance of the institute from Sonpur Junction is approximately 7 kilometers. By road, the institute is located on National Highway-19 (NH-19) near Railway Gate No. 4.

The nearest access from Patna is via the JP Setu, which is at a distance of approximately 10 km from the institute. Similarly, the institute is also located about 10 km from Hajipur. The district headquarters Chapra is directly connected to the institute through rail and bus services, and the distance from Chapra is around 50 km.

Additionally, the world-famous Harihar Kshetra Temple and the Sonpur Mela area are situated approximately 8 km away from the institute.

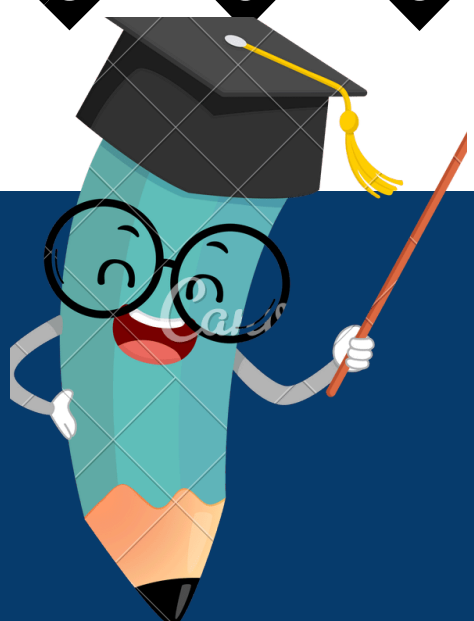

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About the Course

D.El.Ed. stands for Diploma in Elementary Education, a foundational teacher training course for aspiring primary and upper-primary school teachers, focusing on child development and teaching methods, with eligibility typically requiring 12th-grade completion and specific age/marks criteria, especially prominent in states like Bihar through exams like the Bihar DEEd JEE conducted by the BSEB. It's a crucial qualification for elementary teaching, often a 2-year program, with recent application/result cycles in late 2025 for Bihar.

What it is:

- A professional diploma preparing educators for elementary (primary) levels.
- Covers subjects like child psychology, teaching techniques, and foundational learning.

Eligibility :

- Educational: Passed 12th grade (50% for General, 45% for SC/ST) or equivalent.
- Age: Around 17-35 years (General), with relaxations for reserved categories (SC/ST/OBC).
- Nationality: Indian citizens, often with Bihar residency for state-specific exams.

Key Points:

- Governing Body : Bihar School Examination Board (BSEB).
- Duration: Typically a 2-year course.
- Career: Qualifies individuals to teach at the elementary level in government/private schools.

How to Apply (General Process):

1. Check official notifications (e.g., www.deledbihar.com) for application dates.
2. Fill out the online application form and pay fees.
3. Appear for the entrance exam (like Bihar DEEd JEE).
4. Check results and merit lists.

Syllabus Structure

First Year

The First Year of the D.El.Ed. programme consists of 40 credits carrying a total of 1000 marks. It includes foundational courses, pedagogy papers, skill-based learning, and a School Experience Programme.

The major courses offered are:

1. Understanding Society, Education and Curriculum (F-1) – 4 Credits
2. Child Development and Learning (F-2) – 4 Credits
3. Inclusive Education: Concept and Practices (F-3) – 4 Credits
4. Indian Culture, Heritage and School Education (F-4) – 4 Credits
5. Language Learning and Early Language Development (F-5) – 2 Credits
6. Teaching of Science (Upper Primary Level) (F-6) – 2 Credits
7. Teaching of Mathematics (Upper Primary Level) (F-7) – 2 Credits
8. Teaching of Hindi (Upper Primary Level) (F-8) – 2 Credits
9. Proficiency in English (F-9) – 2 Credits
10. Reading and Reflective Discussion (F-10) – 2 Credits
11. Art and Aesthetic Education (F-11) – 4 Credits
12. Health, Physical Education and Yoga (F-12) – 4 Credits
13. School Experience Programme – I (SEP-1) – 4 Credits

A four-week school-based activity focusing on observation and participation.

Total for First Year:

- Credits: 40
- Marks: 1000 (570 External + 430 Internal)

Second Year

The Second Year also carries 40 credits and 1000 marks, emphasizing advanced pedagogy, internships, and specialization.

The courses included are:

1. Contemporary Indian Society and Education (S-1) – 4 Credits
 2. Learning, Teaching and Classroom Processes (S-2) – 4 Credits
 3. Action Research (S-3) – 2 Credits
 4. School Internship (S-4) – 2 Credits
 5. Gender, School and Society (S-5) – 4 Credits
 6. Pedagogy of English (Primary Level) (S-6) – 2 Credits
 7. Pedagogy of Mathematics (Upper Primary Level) (S-7) – 2 Credits
 8. Pedagogy of Hindi (Upper Primary Level) (S-8) – 2 Credits
 9. Optional Course (Any One) (S-9) – 2 Credits
- Options include: Sanskrit, English, Physical Science, History, Geography, Economics, Bengali, or Urdu.
- School Experience Programme – II (SEP-2) – 16 Credits
- A 16-week teaching internship, providing hands-on classroom teaching experience.

Total for Second Year:

- Credits: 40
- Marks: 1000 (455 External + 545 Internal)

Grand Total (Two Years)

- Credits: 80
- Total Marks: 2000
 - External Assessment: 1025
 - Internal Assessment: 975



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Academic Calendar

The institutions implementing the D.El.Ed Curriculum shall be required to develop an annual academic calendar in the beginning of the session and organize various activities in accordance with the planned calendar.

Academic Session

Duration of Session:
1st July to 30th June

Total number of working days in a session:

225 days (excluding Saturdays, Sundays and holidays)
The institutions shall ensure that 200 teaching days are available each year as per the requirements of NCTE Regulations, 2009. Out of these 200 teaching days, SEP has to be organized for four week (First Year) and 16 week (Second Year) in each year.

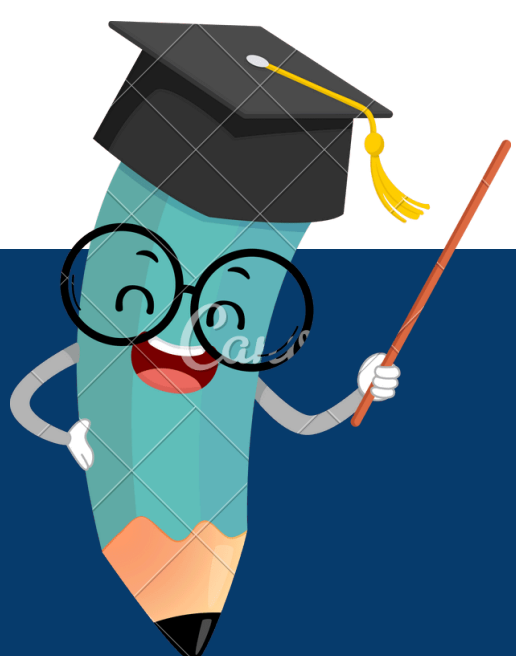
The institutions must function for at least 42 hours in a week. The institutions may work -Six days a week (@ 7 hours per day).

The institutions shall also ensure that 65 contact hours are available for each course, covering both theoretical and practical components. Eight hours per week may be devoted to tutorials, library work, co-curricular activities, sports, etc.

Scheme of Evaluation

The student-teachers shall be required to 85% attendance each in the first and second year. This course shall have components of internal and external assessment.

- The external assessment shall be based on students' achievement in the term-end examination in the theoretical components.
- The internal assessment shall be based on the student-teachers' performance in the practicum component.
- Projects and assignments included in the practicum components shall be assessed internally by the faculty under the guidance and supervision of the Principal of the institution.

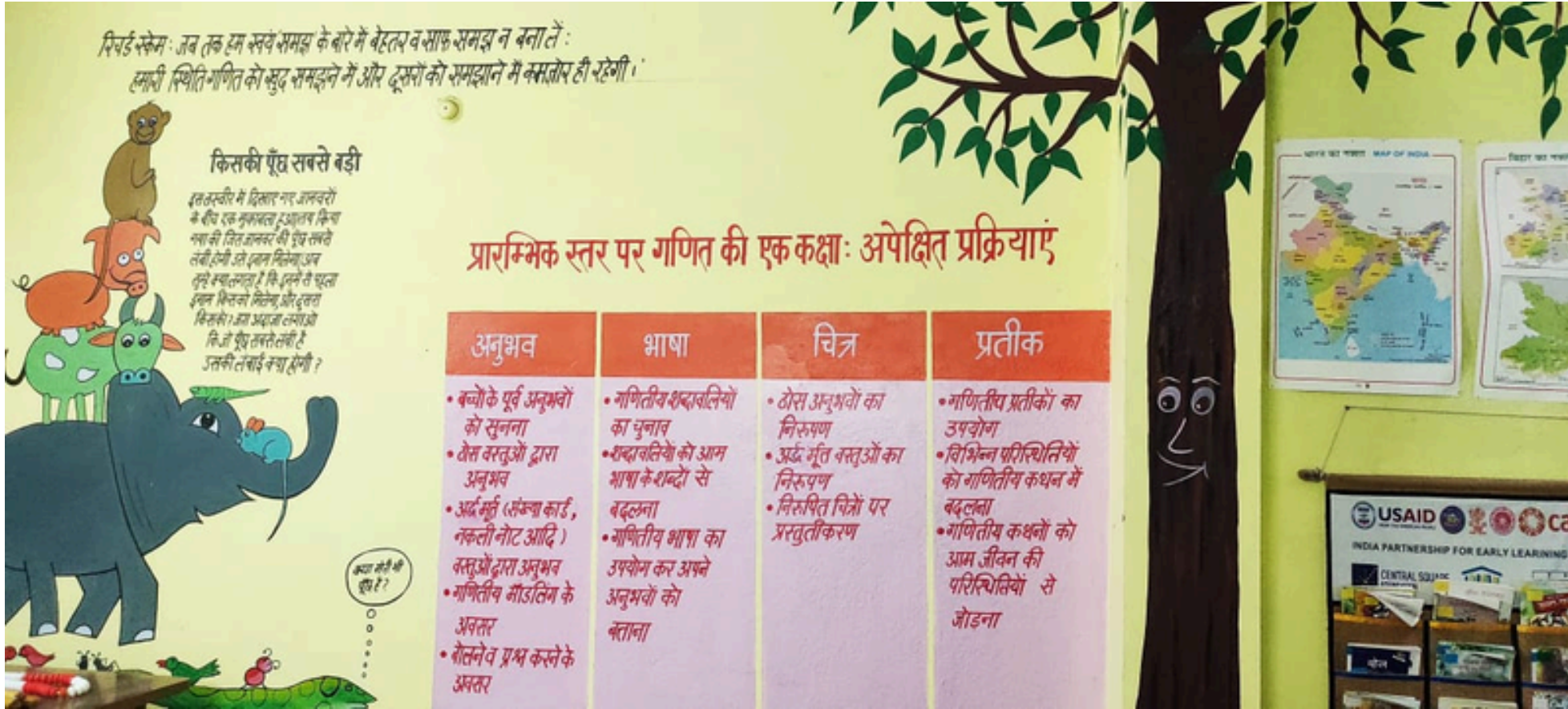
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Academic Activities / Achievements

1. In-Service Training

During the academic years 2023–24, 2024–25, and 2025–26, various training programs based on different subjects and educational innovations were successfully organized for approximately 13,081 in-service teachers, including BPSC-appointed teachers.

2. Pre-Service Training

Pre-service training programmes are conducted regularly with the active participation of about 200 trainees in each training session.

3. Support in Teacher Appointment through BPSC and Other Competitive Examinations

- Under TRE-1 and TRE-3, approximately 147 D.El.Ed. trainees were appointed to teaching positions.
- In addition, around 100 trainees achieved success in other competitive examinations.
- In each training batch, approximately 75 % of the trainees qualified the CTET, reflecting the quality and effectiveness of the training programmes.

4. Participation in Educational Surveys

The institute, in collaboration with reputed educational organizations such as NCERT, SCERT, and ASER (Pratham), organized various educational survey programmes and workshops.

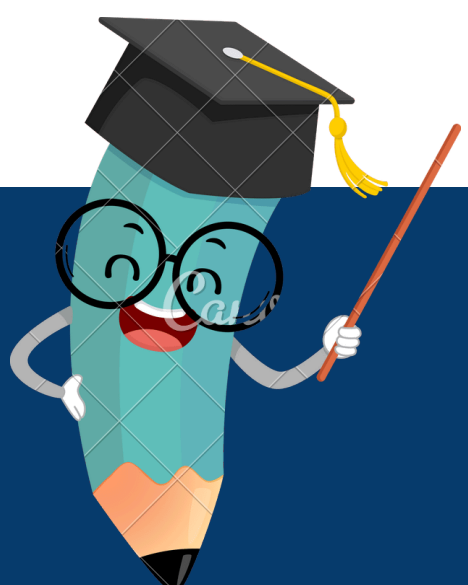
Additionally, various programmes related to classroom-based teaching, home-based learning, assessment activities, and overall educational improvement were effectively implemented at the district and block levels.

5. Collaboration with Aga Khan Foundation (AKF)

Under the School 2030 Programme, special training, innovative teaching practices, and educational interventions were successfully implemented for D.El.Ed. trainees in collaboration with the Aga Khan Foundation (AKF).

Educational Innovations / Initiatives

- Workshops and subject-expert meetings were organized with the objective of promoting research and action research.
- To enhance the effectiveness and quality of the teaching–learning process, digital e-content development was encouraged, and instructional materials were developed under DIKSHA courses and MIP.
- Through Item Development workshops, special emphasis was placed on the development of question banks and the preparation of quality-based assessment items.
- For Science and Social Science teachers, hands-on, activity-based training programs were organized to promote experimental and inquiry-based teaching approaches.
- In coordination with the Education Department and the Health Department, district teachers were provided with training related to health and hygiene.



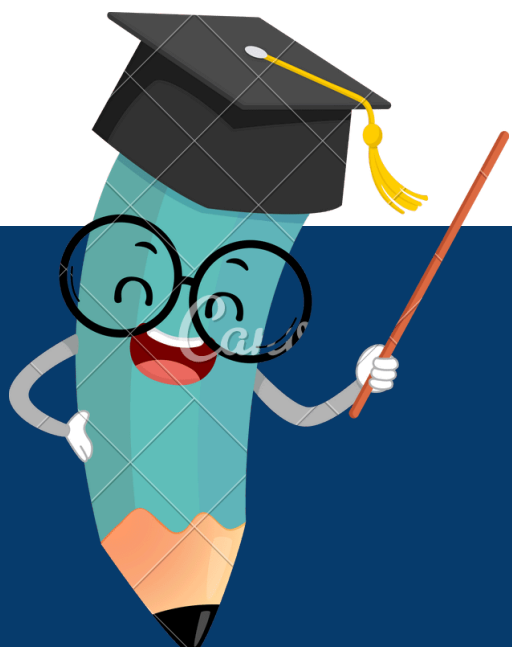
